

The 2021 physics prize is awarded for models of the climate and other complex systems.



Syukuro Manabe and Klaus Hasselmann for the physical modelling of Earth's climate, quantifying variability and reliably predicting global warming"





Syukuro Manabe has developed models that demonstrate that increased levels of carbon dioxide in the atmosphere lead to higher temperatures on the earth's surface.











The laureates' tools are being used to produce pharmaceuticals more efficiently, more sustainably and more cheaply.









The medicine prize 2021

The discovery of how certain specific receptors react to temperature and touch allows us to explain our ability to perceive the world around us.







"for his uncompromising and compassionate penetration of the effects of colonialism and the fate of the refugee in the gulf between cultures and continents."






Abdulrazak Gurnah was born on Zanzibar but emigrated to England at the age of eighteen.

In 1987, Gurnah made his debut with the novel *Memory of Departure*. His breakthrough as a writer came with the 1994 novel *Paradise*.






The 2021 peace prize







